

The French program of the Department of Modern Languages gives students the skills necessary to communicate in culturally appropriate ways with French speakers of diverse Francophone communities. Spoken by more than 300 million people on five continents, French is a globally important language of trade, culture, and political systems, and it's the second most taught language in the world. Courses in French range from beginning language to advanced topic seminars and immerse students in discovering *la Francophonie*.

Major Requirements

Depending on course placement*, students will take the following courses:

Elementary French I and II (FRN 105 & 106)

Intermediate French I and II (FRN 207 & 208)

Advanced French I and II (FRN 309 & 310)

Three 400-level seminars

One elective at the 300-level or above

Study abroad/cultural immersion experience

Capstone project (in consultation with the major advisor and the program director)

Minor Requirements

Depending on course placement*, students will take the following courses:
